

## COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

### ► Reports

Council received Report No. EPW-2009-0013 authorizing a release respecting a development agreement between John Link and the Town of Georgina

Council received Report No. DAS-2009-0025 supporting an application for a grant of up to \$50,000 from Human Services and Skills Development Canada to enhance information and communication access in the Council Chambers

Council received Report No. DAS-2009-0026 to expand its marriage solemnization services to after hours and weekends as provided in the Marriage Act

Council received Report No. PB-2009-0032 approving an application to deem Lot 76, Plan 472 not to be a lot on a registered Plan of Subdivision; 12 Irving Drive, Pefferlaw

Council received Report No. PB-2009-0033 approving an application to deem Lot 257, plan 231 not to be a lot on a registered Plan of Subdivision; 238 Parkway Avenue, Keswick

Council approved Report No. PB-2009-0034 directing the Town Solicitor to bring a motion before the Ontario Municipal Board to dismiss the appeals filed by 970547 Ontario Inc. pursuant to Sections 17(45), 34(25) and 51(53) of The Planning Act, Part Lots 21 and 22, Concession 7, 54 Riverside Drive, Pefferlaw

### ► Deputation

Council received a deputation by Hugh Sibbald concerning his appreciation to everyone for their generosity over the years with respect to the Red Barn Theatre.

Council proclaimed the month of May as 'Sexual Assault Prevention Month' throughout the Town of Georgina

► Actions

Council directed that staff submit an grant application to the Communities Component of the Build Canada Fund for the design and construction of the elements of the Civic Centre Master Plan that have not yet been undertaken and approved a budget of up to \$15,000,000 for design and construction of the Civic Centre Master Plan Project and subject to an agreement with Build Canada, approve debenture financing in an amount equal to one third of the construction costs, representing Georgina' share under the Communities Component of the Build Canada Fund.

Council received correspondence from the Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority inviting participation in the 'Community Tree Planting' events being held throughout York Region during the month of May.

Council proclaimed the week of April 26 to May 2 as 'Cleaning For A Reason Week' throughout the Town of Georgina in support of improving the lives of women undergoing treatment for cancer.

Council proclaimed the week of June 7 to 14 as 'Pride Week' throughout the Town of Georgina.

Council endorsed the position of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville petitioning the Ministry of Transportation to resolve outstanding issues associated with Highway 48 such as relief from setback requirements and the issuance of permits and approvals for public works on or adjacent to the highway.

Council received the Ministry of Transportation's annual compliance monitoring report for the Highway 404 extension, advanced bridge structures at Mount Albert Road, the Town of East Gwillimbury and the Region of York.

Council granted permission to the Royal Canadian legion to host its annual D-Day Parade and service on Sunday, May 31, 2009 to commence at the Peter Gzowski Library, at 1:30 p.m., then east along Black River Road to the Briar Hill Cemetery for a 2:00 p.m. service.
