

## **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

### **TOWN OF GEORGINA – JUNE 22, 2009**

#### **► Reports**

◆ Council approved Report No. LS-2009-0012 wherein the Town is to enter into a one-year agreement with Angelo Stamboultzis for Part Lot 11, Concession 9 at the north-east corner of Kennedy Road and Lake Drive, for the purpose of establishing a parking lot to help alleviate parking problems in the general area.

◆ Council received Report No. PB-2009-0050, approving an application by John and Jaqueline Boyd to deem lots 30-32, Plan 176, not to be lots on a Registered Plan of Subdivision

◆ Council received Report No. PB-2009-0051, approving an application by James and Josephine Johnston to deem lot 54, Plan 231, not to be a lot on a Registered Plan of Subdivision.

◆ Council received Report No. PB-2009-0049 approving the Town initiated Official Plan Amendments, being amendments 105 through 109, to incorporate into the Town's Official Plan and Secondary plans, policies on pre-consultation and submission requirements, complete applications and additional site plan control matters.

→ the 'pre-consultation by-law' will require applicants to consult with the Town prior to the submission of certain planning applications under The Planning Act.

→ the 'delegation by-law' will delegate certain administrative functions related to the processing of planning applications under The Planning Act to staff.

#### **► Actions**

◆ Council referred Ms. Mell's Grade 5/6 class request to consider a smoking ban at all baseball diamonds within the Town, to the Director of Leisure Services to contact the various representatives of the local softball and fastball leagues to determine if there may be an interest for such a ban. The Leisure Services Department is to report back to Council once this information has been obtained.

◆Council endorsed the following nominations for the 2009 Heritage Community Recognition Program; Roland Peacock for the ;'Lieutenant Governor's Ontario Heritage Award for Lifetime Achievement', Nancy Banks for the 'Cultural Heritage' award, Klaus Pusch for the 'Built Heritage' award and Jane Meredith and Annabel Slaight for the 'Natural Heritage' award.
