

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

TOWN OF GEORGINA – MARCH 29, 2010

► Reports

- ◆ Council received Report No. DAS-2010-0017, detailing the Remuneration and Expenses of Members of Council and Council appointees to local boards, as required under The Municipal Act.
- ◆ Council received Report No. EPW-2010-0011 waiving the provisions of the Purchasing By-law to issue a Purchase Order to AECOM Ltd. for consulting service with regard to bridge and culvert rehabilitation work, Contract No. EPW2010-027.
- ◆ Council received Report No. EPW-2010-0012 authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to apply for funding from Transport Canada for the installation of gates at CN Railway Crossing on Clovelly Cove in Port Bolster.
- ◆ Council received Report No. EPW-2010-0013 being the 2009 Summary Report prepared pursuant to Schedule 22 of Regulation 170/03, The Safe Drinking Water Act.
- ◆ Council received Report No. EPW-2010-0014, passing an amendment to the Rate By-law schedules; replacing Schedules 'A' and 'B' of By-law 2002-0107 (PWO-3) to reflect the actual works constructed to service the Willow Beach Area and the properties be assessed frontage and connection charges, and repealing By-law 2003-0139 (PWO-5) to include the streets in the community of Balfour Beach in these schedules referred to above.
- ◆ Council received Report PB-2010-0014 being an application to amend Zoning By-law 500, Yorkwood Shopping Centre, Plan 65M-2675, Block 244; 24018 Woodbine Avenue, Keswick, to permit the construction of a stand-alone, single-tenant building containing 510 square metres of gross floor area, proposed to be located at the south end of the site adjacent to the existing Liquidation World, in the parking area fronting onto Woodbine Avenue. The applicants will return to Council for a second public meeting concerning this application.

► Action

- ◆ Council proclaimed the week of April 17 to 26, 2010, as 'Ontario Coaches Week' throughout the Town of Georgina.
- ◆ Council proclaimed the month of May as 'International Building Safety Month' to support and recognize the critical role their building departments and building officials play in maintaining and improving public safety.

- ◆Council received for information correspondence from Wayne Brakeboer, Chair, Newmarket Chamber of Commerce, requesting local governments make the electricity supply issue a priority and move expeditiously towards an immediate solution.
- ◆Council endorsed the 2010 Lincoln M. Alexander Award, an award to honour young Ontarians who have demonstrated exemplary leadership in contributing toward the elimination of racial discrimination.
- ◆Council received for information two pieces of correspondence, one from Carl Isenburg, President and CAO, Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC), concerning negotiations with the Ontario Public Service Employees Union (OPSEU) and the other from Warren Thomas, President and Ivan Herrington of the Ontario Public Service Employees Union (OPSEU) concerning service quality issues at the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC).
- ◆Council received for information correspondence from Sandra Kranc, City Clerk, City of Oshawa, requesting consideration of its decision on the MOE issuance of the Notice of Completion of the Ministry review for the Durham and York Residual Waste Study Amended Environmental Assessment.
