Ref	General Comments	Recommendation
.1	The document reads as a 'Framework', providing strategies and initiatives for development / investment, with focus on four components of the community – the three Urban Centres, the Queensway Corridor, Woodbine Avenue and New Neighbourhoods. As such, the few 'guidelines' provided lack sufficient detail to guide design. As an example, with reference to Section 1.2, bullet #4 – 'Create a Retail Focus' is stated as a development directive rather than an urban design guideline. Instead, it should read 'Create a built environment that supports/enhances a retail focus for the Glenwoods Urban Centre'.	<ul> <li>A new set of Urban Design Guidelines are recommended.</li> <li>These new guidelines should:</li> <li>focus on design rather than development strategies / initiatives; using design language;</li> <li>reference the relationship of the guidelines to the Official Plan and Zoning and the approvals process;</li> <li>address all components of the community;</li> <li>In addition to being 'easily understood', the guidelines need to be user friendly and avoid language that may be highly subjective; for example, words such as 'beautiful' and 'significant' have no measurable meaning unless they are defined;</li> </ul>

	Consider including Schedule F1: Keswick Land Use Plan and also consider structuring the document to align with the Land Use Categories.	A general overview of the policy framework (OP and Zoning) and describe the context of the Town. Intent and purpose of the Guidelines should be described and, ir particular, with respect to the approvals process.
		Vision
		A statement that describes the aspirations of the community with respect to its built environment – its form and function. It should reference the Town of Georginal Official Plan Vision and the design policies contained therein. Also, include the urban design vision/strategy for Keswick.
		<b>Urban Design Principles</b> provide guidance on how the community will be physically arranged, and its component elements shaped, in order to achieve the stated vision. This could include, for example:
		Protection and enhancement of surrounding environmental lands/natural features, while broadening opportunities for public access, enjoyment, education and stewardship.

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Recognition of the scale and form of development/existing built character of the area.
Establishment of a variety of <b>public spaces</b> to support cultural events, festivals and community life throughout the year.
Creation of animated, safe and comfortable human- scaled streets that enhance mobility for pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles.
Promotion of a mix of uses within a variety of building forms, including a range of housing types and opportunities for retail, commercial and community uses.
Provision of connected systems of parks, open space, trails and streets that link to the lake edge.

Describe the structure of the community by way of each of its component elements, their organization, character, function and hierarchy.
<ul> <li>Centres: Glenwoods, Maskinonge and Uptown Keswick</li> <li>Corridors: Queensway (Mixed Use), and Woodbine (Commercial Employment)</li> <li>Neighbourhoods (Existing and New)</li> <li>Streets (Road Pattern) and Blocks</li> <li>Streetscape hierarchy</li> <li>Parks / Open Space System: Town Parks, Neighbourhood Parks, Parkettes, Village Urban Squares, Waterfront Parks</li> <li>Special Character Elements: Gateways, View Vistas / Corridors, Heritage</li> </ul>
