## **NEW APPLICANT – LOTTERY LICENCE**

In order to qualify for a lottery license, an "eligible" organization must demonstrate that it exists to provide services in one of these charitable classifications:

- a) The relief of poverty
- b) The advancement of education
- c) The advancement of religion
- d) Other charitable purposes beneficial to the community, not falling under a), b), or c)

The organization must also:

- have been in existence for at least one year;
- have provided charitable community services consistent with the primary objects and purposes
  of the organization for at least one year;
- propose to use proceeds for charitable purposes or objects that benefit Ontario and its residents; and
- assume full responsibility for the conduct and management of its lottery events.

When an organization first applies for any type of lottery license, or whenever an eligibility review is required, it must provide all of the following information and documents that apply to it:

- A copy of its letters patent;
- · A copy of its constitution and by-laws;
- · A copy of its budget for the current year;
- · A copy of its financial statements for the preceding year;
- · A list of its Board of Directors;
- Latest report to the Public Guardian and Trustee, if applicable;
- · Revenue Canada notification of registration letter, if applicable;
- Annual Report, if applicable;
- · Membership List, if applicable;
- Detailed outline of programs/services
  - o How they are delivered to clients, specific costs, supporting materials, etc.

An eligibility review may take up to 30 days to determine eligibility.

Once your organization has been deemed eligible by the Lottery Licensing Officer, a Lottery Trust Account must be opened and a Designated Members in Charge form must be completed. When your organization is ready to apply, a lottery application will be provided, in which you will outline the lottery details reflecting your event.
