The calendar is full of information on what goes into your blue box and green bin, as well as tips on composting, and proper disposal of grease and hazardous waste products.

I am certain you will find the calendar to be very informative to help you help us in our efforts to reduce waste going to landfill and to keep our community clean and beautiful.

Curbside collection reminders



Place garbage, green bins, blue boxes and yard waste at the curb by 7 a.m. on your regular scheduled day, but not earlier than 8 p.m. the night before. No strapping devices.

During severe weather, pick-up may be delayed. Two bags of garbage can be placed out for collection without a tag every other week. Each additional bag requires a bag tag prominently displayed to a maximum of the five-item limit. Tags are \$2 each and can be purchased at local stores, library branches and the Civic Centre.

Note: there is never a limit to the number of green bins, blue boxes or yard waste containers.

Metal or plastic cans

Must have 2 handles and a secure lid

• Do not use ties/bungee cords

Maximum 50cm (20 in.) x 90cm

• Maximum weight 22 kg (50 lbs)

(36 in.) and maximum 98 Litres

Acceptable containers for garbage

Plastic bags

- Must be securely tied
- No loose grocery/kitchen catcher bags
- Do not place sharp objects inside bags.
 Place these materials in a separate,
 sealed and labeled cardboard box.
- Maximum 76cm x 122cm (30" x 48")
- Maximum weight 22 kg (50 lbs)

Plastic recycling bags and blue box netting

You may have noticed plastic recycling bags and blue box netting for sale in your local retail stores. Please be advised that the Town does not permit recycling in plastic bags or netting on blue boxes. The plastic bags and nets can accidentally be caught in the waste collection equipment posing a hazard to the waste collection workers.

These items are not picked up:

Hazardous and biomedical waste; household paints, solvents and pesticides; syringes and needles; car parts and tires; propane tanks; and construction/demolition waste. Disposal information for these items can be found throughout this calendar, or by calling 1-866-665-6752.

Blue Box Program

To assist in the continued success of the Town's Recycling Program, and to ensure your blue box material is picked up, we kindly remind you of the following:

- Size of acceptable container 50cm (20 inches) in height and 50cm (20 inches) in width or length.
- Sorting of materials is not necessary.
- Make sure your blue box is easily visible at curbside. Do not stack garbage bags or containers on top.
- Must be curbside no later than 7 a.m. on your designated collection date. Time of the day for collection in your area may be changed at anytime, without notice.
- No garbage, plastic bags or food shall be put in the blue box.
- Blue boxes and green bins can be purchased at the Civic Centre or through Service Georgina at info@georgina.ca or by calling 905-476-4301.
 Bins are delivered directly to your address by GFL on your next collection day.
- Broken green bins and blue boxes can be exchanged for new ones. Residents can contact GFL and request a replacement bin be delivered directly to their home. Contact GFL at 1-866-421-5625 to arrange delivery.

User Pay Garbage Program

The user pay garbage program allows each household two bags of garbage to be set out without a tag every other week. It allows three more with tags to a maximum of five bags. Garbage tags must be prominently displayed to ensure collection. No strapping devices are permitted.

Large Item Fee

A large item tag is needed for large items such as furniture, mattresses, box springs, toilets, appliances and carpeting. Large item tags are \$12.

Some points to remember when putting out your garbage:

- All items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on the day of collection or no earlier than 8 p.m. the night before collection.
- Disposable bags designed and sold for the purpose of containing garbage shall not exceed the size of 75 cm (30") by 100 cm (48").
- Rigid refuse containers are to be reusable metal or plastic, and shall not exceed the size of 50 cm (20") in diameter and 90 cm (36") in height and also must have handles and a lid.
- Total weight of any full can, container or bag cannot exeed 22 kgs (50 lbs).

Yard Waste Program

Yard waste is collected with recycling every second week from April to November. There is no limit on the amount of yard waste that can be placed with collection providing acceptable label containers are used (yard waste stickers are available at no charge).

Use environmentally friendly Kraft paper bags or regular garbage container. Tree and shrub clippings should be tied with string and bundled. The maximum diameter of the trees and shrub clippings is 60cm (24 inches) and 90cm (36 inches) in length. Tree stumps will not be collected. Bundles or bags shall not exceed 22kg (50lbs) in weight.

Note: the Town does not accept grass clippings, dirt or sod in curbside yard waste collection.

White Goods and Metal Items Pickup

To arrange for white goods pick-up: Residents must contact Green for Life at 1-866-421-5625. Each item requires a \$12 large item tag prominently displayed.

Georgina will now accept:

- Aluminum foil, trays, and plates
- Empty metal paint cans (lid removed)
- Empty aerosol cans
- Gable top containers such as milk cartons
- Aseptic packaging including juice boxes
- All rigid plastic food containers


 Tags are not required for: The blue box, bag tag exemption days (limit of 5), leaf and yard waste days, and Christmas tree pickup days.

Seaweed

Seaweed is collected bi-weekly as yard waste. Rigid containers can be used. Drill holes in bottom to drain water.

White Goods Examples:

Refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, metal bathtubs, hot water heaters, freezers, barbecues (no propane tanks), swing sets, bicycles and lawn mowers. To arrange a curbside collection, contact Green for Life at 1-866-421-5625. White goods require a \$12 large item tag.



Waste and recycling tips

To help make waste and recycling pickup as easy and efficient as possible, residents are reminded of the following:





 Do place items at the end of the driveway/curb so they are visible to the operator collecting them.





 Do not leave items half way up the driveway for operators to collect.





 Do bundle items in your blue bin and place heavier items on top to prevent them from blowing away and littering the street.





 Do not place bins and garbage bags on top of or behind snow banks in the winter.





 Do use the proper containers for garbage recycling, green bin items and yard waste.





 Do not overload your containers or use strapping devices. Two containers without a tag, up to three more with tags, for a five item limit, can be set out for collection every other week. Ensure the garbage tag is prominently displayed.

Blue boxes and green bins are collected every week

Recycling bins can be ordered by calling Service Georgina at 905-476-4301 or by calling Georgina Public Library. Visit georgina.ca/**WasteandRecycling** to find out "What Goes Where."

Take the "whole home" approach to diversion. Every room in your house that has a garbage can has materials that can be separated for the green bin and blue box. Please consider using reusable bags and travel mugs to reduce waste.

Return used plastic bags to participating retailers for recycling.

Compostable bags are the preferred option when lining your green bins.

For replacement of broken bins, contact GFL at 1-866-421-5625. Replacement bins are delivered directly to your home.





Yard waste

Yard Waste is collected with recycling every second week from April to November, as noted throughout this calendar (there are some exceptions due to statutory holidays).

There is no limit on the amount of yard waste that can be placed for collection, providing that acceptable labeled containers are used (yard waste stickers are available at no charge at the Civic Centre).

Acceptable containers:

Place weeds, plant trimmings, and leaves in paper yard bags or any regular garbage container that has handles.

Bundle branches as shown. Use twine only, no ropes please.

No plastic bags please!






These items should not be placed with yard waste: Kitchen scraps, grass clippings, rocks, dirt, sod, tree stumps, larger branches, flower pots/trays, painted or treated wood and animal droppings.



FIGHT THE BITE! AGAINST BLACKLEGGED TICKS AND LYME DISEASE

What is Lyme disease?



Lyme disease is caused by a bacteria called Borrelia burgdorferi which is spread through the bite of an infected blacklegged tick.

Symptoms of Lyme disease may include:

A skin rash
 Fever or chills

· Fatigue or

weakness

- Dizziness or confusion
- Muscle and joint pain
- Headache
 Swollen lymph nodes

See your health care provider if you develop symptoms of Lyme disease after a tick bite or after visiting a wooded or brushy area.


What are blacklegged ticks?



- Ticks are small bugs that feed off the blood of animals and humans
- Adult ticks are the size of a sesame seed and nymphs are the size of a poppy seed
- Ticks are found on tall grasses and bushes in wooded areas
- They can attach and feed up to five days

Protect yourself in wooded or brushy areas

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved clothing and closed footwear
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- · Walk in the middle of trails
- · Shower when you get home
- Check yourself, your family and your pets for ticks
- Remove attached ticks as soon as possible



If you find a tick on you or a family member remove it quickly




- Grasp the tick with tweezers as close as possible to your skin and pull it straight out
- Do not put anything on the tick or try to burn it off
- Disinfect the area with rubbing alcohol







What is West Nile virus? West Nile virus is spread to humans from the bite of an infected mosquito.


How to protect yourself when outdoors

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved shirts and pants
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- Cover up at dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active



How York Region protects you

York Region's West Nile Virus Program includes larviciding over 100,000 catch basins during the summer and using mosquito traps to capture and test for West Nile virus infected mosquitoes.



Mosquito-proof your home

- Clean up areas of standing water around your home
- Ensure door and window screens are tight-fitting and in good repair
- Clean up pools / pool covers
- Turn over wading pools
- · Empty out flower pots
- Clear eavestroughs, storm and roof gutters
- · Clean bird baths weekly
- Empty water in old tires





What is Household Hazardous Waste?



Household hazardous waste (HHW) is anything in your home that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous and is no longer needed. It should be brought to a HHW depot where it will be disposed of safely.

Examples of HHW:

- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Batteries
- Cleaning products
- Cosmetics
- Fertilizers
- Fluorescent light bulbs and tubes
- Gasoline (containers may not be returned)
- Glues and adhesives
- · Nail polish and polish remover
- · Paints (liquid and solid)

- · Paint thinner and varnish remover
- · Perfume and cologne
- Pesticides, insecticides and herbicides
- Pharmaceuticals
- Propane cylinders/tanks
- Pool chemicals
- Sharps (needles/syringes) must be in puncture proof container
- · Used motor oil and filters

Residents can drop off 60L of household hazardous waste and 20 compact fluorescent tubes per household per day.

What is Electronic Waste?



Electronic waste (e-waste) is any electronic equipment in your home that no longer works and cannot be repaired. E-waste should not be thrown in the garbage as these items contain materials considered to be hazardous.

Examples of e-waste:

- Cables
- · Cameras and camcorders
- Cell phones, telephones, pagers and fax machines
- Computer towers, laptops, tablets, modems, keyboards and mice

- · Game systems
- Monitors, printers, scanners and typewriters
- Televisions
- VCRs, DVD players, radios, stereos, speakers

Maximum 50 kg per household per day. Remove all packaging and batteries. Disassembled electronics will not be accepted.

Fats, oils and grease include:

 Butter and margarine, cooking and deep-frying oils, marinades and gravies, meat fats, sauces, shortening and lard, and even salad dressings!

Proper disposal:

- · Allow fats, oils and grease to cool
- . Use a spatula to wipe or scrape FOG into your green bin
- Drop off oils that do not harden, such as liquid cooking oils, at a York Region waste depot



What goes in the green bin?

Green bin tip: Lining your green bin with compostable bags is no longer mandatory but is the preferred option. Please refrain from using plastic bags to ensure collection.

Food and food scraps

If you can eat it, it goes in the green bin, as well as fish/meat bones, shells, fat, grease and lard (solidified), small amounts of cooking oil (can be placed in milk cartons), baking supplies, dairy products, egg shells, coffee filters/grounds and tea bags, corn cobs/husks, and nuts/shells.

Soiled or shredded paper

Shredded paper may be placed in the green bin in small amounts. Other paper products that go in the green bin include; butcher and cheese paper (no waxed or plastic liner), microwave popcorn bags, flour and sugar bags, muffin paper, soiled paper plates, paper towels and tissues, paper serviettes, and any non-waxed paper or cardboard that contains food residue (sauce, cheese, etc). No waxed paper.

Personal care items

Diapers, hair, nail clippings, sanitary products, tampons, incontinence products, tissues.

Pet products

Animal bedding, pet waste, kitty litter, bird seed, pet food, pet fur, feathers and sawdust (wood sources only).


Houseplants and flowers

Metal item recycling • bulky item pick-up

Large metal items

Large metal items such as appliances, barbecues (no propane tanks), bed frames, furnaces, hot water heaters, metal bathtubs, storage sheds and bicycles must be recycled. These items require a \$12 large item tag. To arrange a curbside collection, contact Green for Life at 1-866-421-5625.

*Note: For safety, remove doors from fridges, freezers, and ovens. Each item requires a garbage tag prominently displayed.

If a special collection is not booked, metal items will not be collected. Metal appliances and scrap metal can also be dropped off at select York Region Depots. *See page 3 for details.

Furniture, mattresses, box springs, plastic lawn furniture, toilets, carpeting, etc.

Items to be placed at curbside for pick up on your regular garbage collection day with a \$12 large item tag attached. Break down or separate large/heavy items, if possible. Bundle small loose pieces. Tie carpeting and linoleum in rolls measuring no longer than 1.2 metres (4 ft.) and weighing less than 20 kilograms (44 lbs.). Each piece or bundle counts toward the one item limit.

Construction and demolition waste

Take these materials to one of the York Region Community Environmental Centres. See page 3 for locations and hours of operation or donate good quality materials to a charitable organization.

What goes in the blue box?

All containers must be **EMPTY** and **SCRAPED**.

Paper

Cardboard

- · Cardboard boxes (flattened, tied and smaller than 2'x 2'x 1')
- Pizza boxes (clean)
- Shoe boxes

Newsprint/Paper/Posters

- Calendars and posters
- Flyers
- Magazines
- Newspapers (no plastic bags)
- Telephone books

Food and Drink Containers

- Drink boxes or tetra packs (no straws)
- Frozen food boxes
- Frozen juice containers (lids separate)
- · Juice and milk cartons

Other Paper

- Boxboard (cereal boxes)
- Bristol board (no decorations)
- Egg cartons/flats
- Greeting cards (plain)
- Paper bags
- Paper tubes/rolls
- Wrapping paper (non-metallic)

Plastic

Plastic household containers

- Antifreeze and windshield washer bottles
- Baby wipe containers
- Containers (between 2" to 9" in diameter)
- · Detergent bottles and jugs
- Household cleaning product containers
- Plastic bottles/jugs
- Shampoo bottles (no black plastic)

Plastic food and drink containers

- · Bakery trays and clamshells
- Clear beverage cups (no flat lids)
- Clear take-out food containers
- Egg cartons (clear plastic)
- Tubs and lids (yogurt, sour cream)
- Water and pop bottles (lids on)

Steel containers

- Cookie tins
- · Empty aerosol cans
- Empty metal paint cans (lids separate)
- · Food and soup cans

Aluminum Containers

- Aluminum foil (clean, rolled into ball)
- Aluminum plates and trays
- Pop cans

Glass

Remove lids and place separately in the blue box.

- Bottles
- Jars



Metal

All green bin waste must be BAGGED and TIED.



What does NOT go in the green bin?

- Baby/cleaning wipes Plastic bags/film
- Clothing Cutlery

- Plastic food containers
- Dryer lint

- Black plastic
- Coffee cups
- Coffee pods/discs
- Dishes/glasses
- Foam packaging
- Food scraps/residue
- Masks/gloves/wipes
- Medical waste (needles/syringes)

- · Plastic bags/film (of any kind)
- Propane cylinders/tanks
- · Take-out pop cups
