# 7. Short-Term Results Expected:

Safe road and reduced risk.

# 8. Long-Term Results Expected:

Preservation of Hedge Rd for the foreseeable future.

## 9. Other Comments:

In the fall of 2017, staff brought a Report to Council and received support to address NOW (broken, requiring reconstruction) road needs. Hedge Rd falls within the category of Now Needs even though it was not explicitly identified in the Road Needs Study. The bank between Hedge Road and Lake Simcoe is very steep. Approximately 10 years ago, slippages occurred and emergency repairs were completed to save the road from failure. As a follow up to these issues, in 2011/2012 the Town completed a Slope Stability Assessment (between the Black River and Seaward Drive). The slope and road subbase areas were classified as Critical, Stable with Repair, and Erosion below Culverts. The abutting landowners own the riparian shoreline; therefore, a solution benefitting both parties is an important principle of the works.
