Scheduled for Thursday, May 11 and Friday, May 12, 2023, Georgina Pioneer Village and Archives is hosting the annual Education Days for Rise to Rebellion: an Interactive Re-creation of the 1837 Rebellion of Upper Canada. Unlike any other education program throughout the Greater Toronto Area, students will have a chance to learn about the issues involved in the struggle for responsible government from costumed personalities, and to actually participate in an interactive re-creation of this celebrated episode of Canadian history.

Georgina Pioneer Village and Archives has assembled the talents of re-enactors from the Incorporated Militia of Upper Canada and the Lloydtown Company, as well as numerous historic demonstrators and interpreters, who together will provide you and your students with an unforgettable day of learning.

Curriculum Links:

Rise to Rebellion Education Day is directly linked to the Grade 7 History Strand B: Conflict and Challenges.

As part of Education Day, students will:

- Investigate the causes of the 1837 Rebellion of Upper Canada through interaction with key personalities involved in the conflict.
- Analyse the competing points of view put forward by William Lyon Mackenzie and Sir Francis Bond Head, and examine how their differences led to armed conflict. After booking, each participating class will be assigned a side that they must represent during Education Day. Teachers will then be mailed a preparation package to help them prepare their students for Education Day. These instructions will provoke students to think critically about the issues they will be supporting, and how they differ with the competing point of view.
- Learn appropriate vocabulary used by both sides of the debate over responsible government. Your package will include a list of terms employed by the Rebels and Loyalists. Additionally, through contact with costumed personalities and historical demonstrators, students will have the opportunity to further compare and contrast the words chosen by the local Reform politician and Loyal supporters as they attempt to sway students' opinions.
- Witness first-hand the outcome of the armed conflict between Mackenzie's Rebels and Bond Head's Loyalist forces.
