
Lake Drive Shoreline Action Plan

- Goal: Resolve longstanding shoreline title issues.
- Objective: Offer Eligible Property Owners (EPOs) the chance to acquire clear title to shoreline land.
- **Timeline**: Up to 3 years to complete.



Beach Associations and the Action Plan

About 27 beach associations exclusively use shoreline land within the Action Plan Area.



Beach Associations within the Action Plan Area

- Role: Beach associations are vital community groups involved in preserving and conserving shoreline land along Lake Drive.
- Challenges: Ownership uncertainties around exclusive shoreline use pose significant challenges.



Engagement Process



Engagement Process with Beach Association Members

- Objective: Solicit feedback from Beach Association Members crucial in guiding Council decisions within the Action Plan Area.
- Feedback Collection: Separate engagement processes for members of beach associations and EPOs.
- Timeline: Staff will gather feedback and report to Council in Q1 2024.

Exploring Land Management Approaches

Options for Consideration

- Varied Approaches: Presented to Council in September 2023.
- Diverse Choices: One option may work for some, but not others. We understand that each association is unique.
- Custom Solutions: No set number of options, any combination is possible.

Key Considerations

- Not a one-size-fits-all: Acknowledging the uniqueness of each circumstance.
- Flexibility: Tailored solutions for different requirements.
- Adaptability: Adjusting strategies to specific circumstances.

Land Management Options

- 1. Long-Term Leases:
 - Sustainable Commitment: Building lasting relationships.
 - **Community Stewardship**: Fostering responsible, long-term engagement.

2.<u>Selling of Land</u>:

- Creating Possibilities: Opportunities for positive changes and community investment.
- **Ownership Empowerment**: Encouraging community involvement and pride in ownership.
- **3. Federation of Beach Associations:**
 - Unity and Collaboration: Forging collaborative bonds and collective community efforts.
 - Shared Vision: Bringing diverse groups together for common goals.
- **4. Public Parkland:**
 - **Community Space**: Creating accessible and communal spaces for all to enjoy.
 - Sustainable Land Care: Prioritizing sustainable and accessible options.

5. Status Quo:

- No Change: Keeping things as they are currently.
- Community Continuity: Upholding familiar practices and arrangements.

Considering Costs

Present Stage:

- We are in the process of gathering feedback and understanding concerns. Detailed cost breakdowns for each option are not currently available.

Next Steps:

- After hearing from beach association members, Town staff will analyze the input.
- We will provide Council with a comprehensive cost breakdown and a summary of the feedback.

Decision Making:

 Council will consider this summary, along with staff recommendations, to determine the subsequent steps.

Legal Entities and Feedback

- To enter into a lease or sale agreement with the Town, the Town would require that beach associations become legal entities.
- Recommended form is not-for-profit organizations.
