## **Keswick Cemetery Master Plan and Pioneer Cemeteries management plans**

Council received the report regarding the capital improvements at the Town's municipally owned cemeteries. Council endorsed in principle the Keswick Cemetery Master Plan and the Pioneer Cemeteries Management Plan. Staff were directed to report back with an updated user fee bylaws related to recommendations outlined in the Keswick Cemetery Master Plan and Pioneer Cemetery Management Plan. Council also directed staff to report back on Feb. 28 with recommendations on what could be done this year in terms of funding a selection of priority improvements in 2024 at the Mann and Keswick cemeteries.

### **Cemetery operations review**

Council received the report on the cemetery operations review and approved the

recommendation to direct staff to manage Cooke's Cemetery and Keswick Cemetery, both of which are municipally owned. This will ensure the Town is protecting and retaining its own assets, while achieving complete transparency and control of public records and aligning itself with the legislated requirements of the Bereavement Authority of Ontario. Council also expressed its appreciation to the volunteers who have dedicated their time to participating as members of the Cooke's Cemetery Board and the Keswick Cemetery Board.
