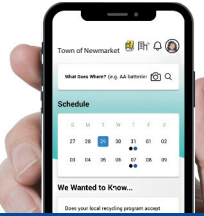

The curbside Blue Box program is now managed and operated by Circular Materials. The enhanced recycling program includes a new recycling cart and collection every other week, beginning Jan. 5, 2026. 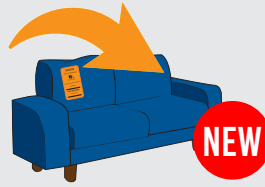

Extra items?

Purchase bag tags for \$2 each at local stores, library branches, Civic Centre, and the MURC. Five item maximum per collection including the 2 free bags.

Large or oversized items?



Starting Jan. 2026, large item collection will be scheduled by call in. Pickups take place on your regular garbage day, each item requires a large item tag (\$12 each) and items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. Max 5 items per collection. Call GFL at 1-866-421-5625 to arrange for curbside collection.

White goods (fridge, washer)

Each item requires a \$12 large item tag. Contact GFL to arrange pickup.

Broken glass or sharp objects

Securely package separately in a box and labelled.

Toilets

Set out at the curb. Must be emptied and separated into two pieces (tank and bowl).

Renovation waste

Such as concrete, wood and drywall are not collected curbside. Visit york.ca/WasteDepots for disposal options.

Organics



- Line your green bin with a certified compostable bag. Securely tie bag.
- Remove plastic packaging and overwrap from food before placing in your kitchen catcher or green bin.
- Tissues, paper towels and napkins belong in the green bin, along with diapers and pet waste.

X Do not place any item made of plastic, rubber, wax, wood, Styrofoam™ or any other garbage in your green bin.

Leaf and yard waste

Place leaf and yard waste in Kraft paper bags or garbage containers (no lids) marked 'Yard waste'.

Maximum weight per container/bundle is 22 kg (50 lbs.)

Bundle branches with twine. Bundles can be up to three feet in length and two feet in diameter.

Individual branches can be up to four inches in diameter.



X Yard waste in plastic bags, cardboard boxes, blue boxes, green bins or unmarked containers will not be collected.

Grass clippings are not accepted.

Curbside Giveaway Days

Place gently used items labelled 'free' at the curb in front of your home for others to take from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Household hazardous waste, eWaste, batteries



Household Hazardous Waste

HHW includes any household items that are corrosive, explosive, flammable, or poisonous. These are not collected curbside and must be taken to the York Region HHW Depot at 23068 Warden Ave. for safe disposal.

Electronic Waste (eWaste)

eWaste includes electronic equipment that no longer works and cannot be repaired. It is not collected curbside and must be taken

to a York Region depot or dropped off for free at one of Georgina's two annual waste events.

Battery Disposal

Batteries should never go in the trash or recycling, as they can cause fires. The Town has partnered with Call2Recycle to provide safe drop-off locations. For a list of where you can drop off your batteries, visit georgina.ca/WasteandRecycling.



Collection reminders



- Ensure material is at the curb by 7 a.m.
- Use Town-approved green bins for organics (max. 12 gallons/45L).
- All garbage and green bins must weigh less than 22kg (50 lbs).
- No attached lids on garbage containers.
- Do not place containers on top of or behind snowbanks, on roadways or sidewalks.
