



Georgina Town Council July 8, 2026

Presentation – Joseph Moncada, Director of Library Services/CEO, and Bobbi Sabatini, Library Board Chair, presenting the Georgina Public Library 2025 Year in Review

Council received the [presentation](#) regarding the Georgina Public Library 2025 Year in Review. Total library traffic grew by 6.4 per cent to more than 500,000, branch visits were up by 13 per cent and online use was up by almost two per cent. The library delivered more than 2,000 programs, an increase of 19.5 per cent. The Maker Space at the Discovery Branch at the Multi-Use Recreation Complex continues to be a success along with popular programs such as the Seed Library and the Lendery.

Old Shiloh Road Bridge Replacement – budget request

Council received the report regarding the Old Shiloh Bridge replacement budget request and approved additional funding for the project to allow the Town to proceed with the design-build contract. At more than 100 years old, the Old Shiloh Road Bridge has outlived its anticipated engineered lifespan and is in need of replacement. It will be replaced with a two-lane bridge and the old bridge will be commemorated with artwork and a historical interpretive board to be displayed at a Town location.

Parking and Loading Study

Council received the report regarding the [Parking and Loading Study](#). Council approved the recommendation that the study be received as a general basis for staff review supporting the preparation of updated parking and loading provisions in the future draft Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw that will be released for public consultation in 2027 and be subject to Council consideration and approval.

2025/2026 Winter maintenance summary

Council received the report regarding the 2025/2026 winter maintenance summary and approved recommendations for funding for snow storage sites, the re-establishment of a salt stockpile prior to the 2026/2027 winter season, and for the pre-season repair and replacement of specified aging winter equipment. Council also endorsed the Significant Weather Event Declaration to be in alignment with the Weather Canada advisories and directed staff to update the necessary policy to be in effect by November 2026 as a standard.

Draft Plan of Subdivision, Official Plan Amendment and Zoning Bylaw Amendment applications, Ainslie Hill II Inc., Part of Lots 21 and 22, Concession 7 (NG), Block 4, Registered Plan 65M-4749, 235 Catering Rd.

Council received the report and approved the revised Draft Plan of Subdivision, Official Plan Amendment and Zoning Bylaw Amendment applications for Ainslie Hill II Inc. for 235 Catering Rd. Council also passed the amending bylaws. This proposed low-density development is located on the east side of McCowan Road and on the west side of Catering Road, south of Baseline Road and north of Country Mile Lane. The revised draft plan includes 528 single detached dwelling units, 86 townhouse units, as well as blocks for parkland, stormwater management, natural heritage features and roads. Matters related to detailed design, phasing and technical requirements will be addressed through the fulfilment of draft plan conditions. In addition, a Holding (H) Symbol in the amending zoning bylaw will restrict development until adequate infrastructure capacity and servicing allocation is available and assigned by Council.
