Waste and recycling

Due to the Canada Day holiday, yard waste pickup for that day will move to Friday, July 2.

Fireworks

Residents are reminded they can set off fireworks without a licence on Victoria Day and Canada Day only, as well as the day before and after each of these holidays. A licence is needed to set off fireworks on any other day of the year. Remember to carefully read and follow the label directions on fireworks' packaging. It is against the Town's by-law to set off fireworks in Town parks/amenities. Remember to follow the COVID-19 provincial guidelines regarding Step 2 of the province's roadmap to reopen. Multi-use Recreation Complex

The Town is moving forward with the largest project in its history – construction of the Multi-use Recreation Complex (MURC). On June 23, 2021, Council approved the full build which will include a Discovery Library branch. Construction is anticipated to begin in September 2021 with anticipated completion and the facility open for use expected in the fall of 2023. The MURC will be located on west side of Woodbine Avenue between Glenwoods Avenue and Ravenshoe Road. It will include a six-lane 25-metre pool, therapy pool, double gymnasium, multi-use meeting and activity rooms, indoor walking track, and active living space.

The anticipated project budget for the MURC is \$50.2 million. It will be 100 per cent funded by development charges. There will be no tax levy increases relating to the MURC capital and operating costs. The project is designed with energy, environment, and occupant health and well-being in mind. It is being built to achieve a Gold level of LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification, one of the highest rankings available. To learn more, visit georgina.ca/MURC.

Georgina COVID-19 vaccination clinic

The vaccination clinic is located at the Georgina Ice Palace, 90 Wexford Dr. As of June 25, eligible individuals who live, work or attend school in York Region who received their first dose on or before May 30 and who already have a second dose appointment booked, now have the option to re-book an earlier appointment. Beaches and waterfront parks

Georgina's beaches and waterfront parks are open with restrictions. Town staff are on site to monitor and control the number of users. Please remember – barbeques or other

cooking devices are not allowed on the beach or in the parks. Parking lots are available to both resident parking pass holders and non-residents. Starting July 1, residents must have a 2021 resident parking pass to park for free in the resident parking lot. For those without a pass, pay-and-display machines are operating. To apply for a parking pass visit georgina.ca/ParkingPass. In order to limit crowds at these locations, available parking spaces have been reduced. Once parking lots reach capacity, they will be closed.

Georgina residents can get a 2021 parking pass on site at De La Salle Beach, Holmes Point and Willow Beach, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily. Residents will need to show their driver's licence, or proof of residency, and provide their licence plate number. Only one parking pass will be issued per vehicle on site. Town parks reopen with new playground equipment

Young's Harbour Park and Glenwoods Park have reopened following the installation of new playground equipment. The updates to the parks include new safety surfaces, new playground equipment, access ramps and new curbing. The ROC Park now includes the Town's first accessible swing, along with new play equipment, safety surfacing and a new AODA compliant walkway and access to the wheelchair swing. 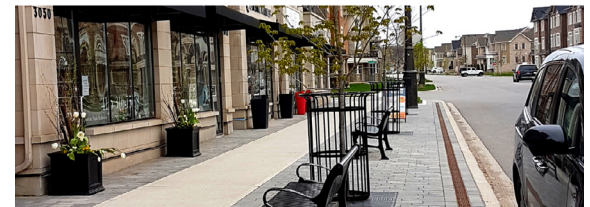


TD Summer Reading Club
