Beaches and waterfront parks

Georgina's beaches and waterfront parks are open with restrictions. Town staff are on site to monitor and control the number of users. Please remember – barbecues or other cooking devices are not allowed on the beach or in the parks. Visit <u>georgina.ca/beaches</u> for more information. Parking lots are available to both resident parking pass holders and nonresidents. As of July 1, residents must have a 2021 resident parking pass to park for free in the resident parking lot. For those without a pass, pay-and-display machines are operating. To apply for a parking pass visit <u>georgina.ca/</u> <u>ParkingPass</u>.

Georgina residents can get a 2021 parking pass on site at De La Salle Beach, Holmes Point and Willow Beach, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily. Residents will need to show their driver's licence, or proof of residency, and provide their licence plate number. Only one parking pass will be issued per vehicle on site.



Road safety signs

You can help remind motorists to slow down and be aware by displaying "Please Slow Down" lawn signs in your neighbourhood. The Town will be giving out the signs on Saturday, July 17 in the ROC roundabout from 9 a.m. to noon. One sign per household. Community cleanup

Pitch-In Week is usually held in the spring. It was missed this year due to the stay-at-home order. The Town is now holding it the week of July 19 to 23. Residents can pick up bags and gloves at the Civic Centre 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the front door, while supplies last. Outdoor recreation programs

The Town is now offering outdoor recreation programs for the entire family such as Yoga, Zumba, canoe/kayak and the Kids

Park programs. The kids park programs are workshop style and include classic camp games, adventures, challenges, and arts and crafts. Cost is \$12 per child, per workshop. Register at <u>georgina.ca/recreation</u>. Drop-ins will not be accepted.

Summer camps

In partnership with the Town of Georgina, Jericho Youth Services is offering summer camps at two locations – the ROC and Sutton Arena Hall. The cost is \$110/week for ages 6 to 13. Paving permits

Water meter replacement

A water meter replacement program is taking place in south Keswick. The approximately 300 affected homes will be notified by the Town. These meters have reached the end of their lifecycle and a mandatory replacement is required. The Town is working with Neptune Technology Group to complete the replacements and these staff will be carrying photo ID badges. Georgina Public Library



Proposal: An application for a Zoning By-law amendment has been submitted by Larkin+ Land Use Planners Inc. on behalf of 1430964 Ontario Ltd. to rezone the above-noted property from a Residential (R) zone to a Low Density Urban Residential (R1) Zone to permit four (4) single detached dwelling units (including one (1) existing single detached dwelling unit) and a Low-density Urban Residential (R2) Zone to permit eight (8) semi-detached dwelling units. The single detached dwelling units are proposed to front Old Homestead Road and the semi-detached dwelling units are proposed to front the Queensway North. Land division of the subject property is proposed via a Subdivision application, which will be submitted at a later date. A key map showing the location of the property is provided.
