Victoria Day holiday

The Town of Georgina wishes everyone a Happy Victoria Day! With the upcoming Victoria Day long weekend, customer service will not be available on Monday, May 24. For the week of May 24, garbage and recycling will move one day later.

Fireworks

Residents are reminded they can set off fireworks without a licence on Victoria Day and Canada Day only, as well as the day before and after each of these holidays. A licence is needed to set off fireworks on any other day of the year. Remember to carefully read and follow the label directions on fireworks' packaging. Always keep a water hose or pail of water close by, and discharge fireworks well away from combustible materials such as buildings, trees and dry grass. Remember to follow the COVID-19 provincial guidelines respecting the stay-at-home-order, and outdoor gatherings are to be limited to members of your own household. Resident parking pass

Residents can get up to four parking passes per household through the online parking pass application form. A 2021 parking pass must be displayed on your dashboard while parked in areas where required by signage. Be sure to check out our new video that shows how to get a parking pass. Beaches and waterfront parks

Waterfront parks and beaches are open with restrictions. Parking lots are available to resident pass holders only, due to the provincial stay-at-home-order. In order to limit crowds at these locations, available parking spaces have been reduced. Once parking lots reach capacity, the parking lots will be closed. Residents will be required to display their 2021 resident parking pass to park in the lots. For those who have yet to obtain one, 2020 passes will be accepted.

The Town has been planning for the summer months with current provincial restrictions, placing public safety at the forefront. The beaches and parks will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily with Town staff on site to monitor and control the number of users permitted in the parks.

Georgina COVID-19 vaccination clinic

The vaccination clinic is located at the Georgina Ice Palace, 90 Wexford Dr. The immunization area at the vaccination clinic has moved to a new area at the back of the Ice Palace.

The entrance, exit and client parking for the clinic are now at the north side of the building. This is an accessible entrance.

Effective Tuesday, May 18, 2021 at 8:30 a.m., anyone 18+ living or working in York Region is now eligible for their COVID-19 vaccination.

The online booking process requires two steps – first create an Active Net account if you don't have one and then book an appointment. You must complete both steps to be registered for an appointment. For information on who is eligible to receive a vaccination, visit york.ca/covid19vaccine. No parking/stopping fines increase

The Town is increasing no parking and no stopping fines in the Waterfront Park Buffer Zone in an effort to reduce illegal parking and stopping in waterfront areas. The Waterfront Buffer Zone includes the entire shoreline area of Lake Simcoe and Town roads in lakeside neighbourhoods. A section along the Black River north of High Street in Sutton is also included. No parking fines will increase from \$30 to \$100 and no stopping fines will increase from \$50 to \$150. Enforcement begins on May

22, the Victoria Day long weekend. The fines apply to all motorists only in the event they are parked or stopped in restricted areas within the Waterfront Park Buffer Zone.
