## Street sweeping

Spring street sweeping operations take place each spring to remove winter sand from Town roads. Weather permitting, street sweeping occurs weekdays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Residents are asked to sweep unwanted sand from their driveways and sidewalks, over the curb and onto the edge of the road for removal by the street sweeper. ## Parking passes

The Town of Georgina has introduced a new online process for resident parking passes. Residents and property owners can now apply online and get a parking pass immediately. Residents can obtain up to a maximum of four parking passes per household. A parking pass must be displayed on your dashboard while parked in areas where required by signage. ## Water and sewer rates

The revised 2022 water and sewer rates were adopted by Council on Dec. 1, 2021. The rate change represents a 5.84 per cent increase when factoring in both metered and capital charges over 2021 rates and is in effect for billings as of April 1. This increase ensures revenue is provided for the operating expenditures for the water and sewer systems. In addition to the metered consumption rate, a capital cost recovery fee of \$21.94 is included with each water and sewer bill. ## Emerald Ash Borer tree removal program

The Town of Georgina has been infested with the Emerald Ash Borer for a number of years and nearly all mature Ash trees are affected. The Town's tree removal program is being expanded to accelerate the removal of Ash trees. ## Urban hens

The Town will allow the keeping of hens in urban areas. After a successful pilot project, Council approved the Urban Hens licensing by-law that will licence, regulate and govern urban hens. A one-time licence fee of \$100 will be required for anyone who wants to apply for a licence to keep backyard hens. ## Fire and Rescue Services

It's the law to have working smoke alarms on every level of your home as well as outside every sleeping area. You could have less than two minutes to escape a fire in your home. Smoke alarms give you and your family early warning and time to get out of the house if a fire starts. Set a monthly reminder to test the smoke alarms in your home by pressing the test button. Change the batteries in smoke alarms at least once a year and replace the entire device every 10 years. Over time, smoke alarms become less sensitive and may not alert you to an emergency as quickly. Consider installing a smoke alarm and carbon monoxide combination unit. These devices can also come with a battery that never needs changing for the life of the device.
