## Christmas tree collection

Christmas tree pickup will be held the week of Jan. 10, 2022. Residents are asked to remove all decorations, nails, tree stands and plastic tree bags. The maximum size is six feet or 1.8 metres. If your tree is larger, cut it into pieces. Reminder: Blue bins, green bins and waste should not be placed on the road or on snow banks. It is important to place these items in the driveway.

Did you know that parked cars on Town streets and sidewalks make plowing difficult? Avoid parking on the street or over a sidewalk after a snowfall. ## COVID-19 update

The Town entered into the modified step 2 of the province's Roadmap to Reopen as of 12:01 a.m. Jan. 5. The province has reintroduced public health and workplace safety measures in response to the rapidly spreading COVID-19 variant, Omicron. All Town indoor sport and recreation facilities will be closed to the public, and all indoor in-person programming cancelled. Those impacted by cancelled programs and third-party rentals will be contacted directly. Each of the three library branches will move to curbside pickup service. ## Winter maintenance event and significant weather event

The Town is committed to providing a consistent level of snow removal service throughout the winter season. Using a combination of Town staff and contractors, plowing, sanding and salting is performed each winter with consideration to safety, environmental and budgetary concerns.

**Winter Maintenance Event:** During a significant winter storm, the Town may declare a Winter Maintenance Event and a Significant Weather Event that will require all parked vehicles be removed from Town roads until the storm event ends, the Town has completed snow removal, sanding and salting operations, and the declaration is lifted.

**Significant Weather Event:** As per the Ontario Municipal Act, a municipality may declare a significant weather event when a weather hazard, either forecast or occurring, has the potential to pose a significant danger to users of the roadways in which they have authority. This declaration suspends the standard timelines required for municipalities to meet their winter maintenance objectives.

Stormwater management ponds are NOT to be used for skating. They are not intended or designed for recreational use as water levels can change rapidly and create unsafe conditions.
