Notice to property owners to destroy noxious weeds

Notice is hereby given to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.W.5, Sections 3, 16, and 23. Every person is hereby advised that unless noxious weeds growing on their lands within the Town of Georgina, in the Regional Municipality of York are destroyed prior to June 15 and throughout the season thereafter, the weed inspector may enter upon said lands and take such action as is necessary to destroy the weeds. All costs incurred for such action shall be charged against the lands and such amounts shall be collected in the same manner as property taxes as specified in the Municipal Act, 2001 as amended. Changes to the bag tag program

Starting July 4, 2022, the Town will implement changes to its Bag Tag program.

- Residents will be able to place up to two bags or containers/items out for pickup every other week on their regularly scheduled collection days and any additional waste will require a bag tag.
- Bag tags are \$2 each and are being sold in groups of five for \$10. They are available at the Civic Centre and all branches of Georgina Public Library. A list of retail distributors will be available on the Town's website. Residents can put up to a maximum of five bags/items of garbage out, two free and three paid. Previously purchased bag tags remain valid and can be used after July 4.

New! Large item fee

The Town is introducing a \$12 fee for large items such as furniture, mattresses, box springs, toilets, appliances and carpeting. Each large item will require its own large item orange tag and the maximum of five collectible items during the regular bi-weekly garbage collection schedule includes tagged large items. The large item tags will be available for purchase at the Civic Centre and all branches of Georgina Public Library. A list of participating retail distributors will be available on the Town's website.



Do you need additional green bins, blue boxes or kitchen catchers?

They are available for purchase by calling the Civic Centre – green bin for \$25, blue bin for \$12 and kitchen catcher for \$6. Bins are delivered directly to your address by GFL following purchase. Broken green bins and blue boxes can be exchanged for new ones. Residents can contact GFL and request a replacement bin be delivered directly to their home. Contact GFL at 1-866-421-5625 to arrange delivery.

Recycle

Did you know?

There is no limit on how many blue boxes or green bins that can be placed out each week.



What goes in the blue box?

- Paper – cardboard, newspapers, food and drink containers, egg cartons
- Plastic – household containers, food and drink containers
- Metal – food and soup cans, empty paint cans, empty aerosol cans
- Aluminum containers
- Glass – bottles and jars

What goes in the green bin?

- All foods (cooked, raw, bones or spoiled)
- Paper products such as paper towels, tissues and food-soiled cardboard
- Personal hygiene products
- Pet/animal waste

Textile recycling

The Town has partnered with Diabetes Canada for a textile diversion program to help support waste diversion. Residents can bring unwanted textiles (adult/children's clothing, footwear, undergarments, towels, pillows and curtains) to the textile donation bins located at –

- Ice Palace (southwest corner), 90 Wexford Dr.
- Civic Centre (near T-ball diamonds)
- Sutton Arena (northeast corner)

Recycle Coach app

Residents are encouraged to use the Recycle Coach app that can be downloaded to any IOS or Android device. The app provides pickup schedules, useful information on waste and the 'what goes where' search function that tells users where a waste item belongs.
