Good Morning

First of all I'm glad to hear everyone is safe

In regards to the Flashing sign this does both record data and let Drivers know their speeds , we do have a process that involves ...

- 1) Complaint about speeding comes in we then put out a radar counter for 7 days.
- 2) If signs of speeding we then put out the speed radar trailer flashing trailer with flashing boards to educate the Drivers that they are going faster than they think they are for 7 days, if there is excessive speed we inform YRP immediately .
- 3) We then remove the trailer to see the results and if Drivers have dropped their speeds to legal posted limits, if not we then notify YRP as to the need for increased enforcement and the best times.
- 4)We then consider our option's as to signage such as Watch for Children or Road Watch.

At the end of the day the York Regional Police are here to provide enforcement , The Town provides the signage that indicates the Rules of the Road.

We are presently discussing how we will resign this area as it appears to be a well-used shortcut now?

I will also pass this concern onto YRP to step up patrols on this section , we will provide them with the best times to have their radar out.

Hello,

First I wanted to take a minute to say thank you for listening to my concerns, and I am happy to see that there is a speed display machine on my street (which is actually very close to my house) It is interesting to see = because most people still haven't changed their driving habits on Riverview Beach Rd - and to see the speeds that they are doing can be jaw dropping.

I am writing today to ask a couple of questions.

Last night my son and I almost got hit by a car. My son was on his scooter, I was walking - we were on the very edge of the road and the car that came flying down the road had the sign flashing at 83kms! The driver wasn't even paying attention and wasn't even moving over to the side to allow us to continue to our house, we had to jump into the ditch to avoid getting hit.

It was very scary, and very frustrating. We do not have sidewalks on our road and so we walkers and kids who ride their bikes or scooters have no other option than to walk on the side of the road. I am wondering if the sign that is there collects data or does it simply flash your speed for you to see. If the sign does collect data what is happening with it? If it doesn't then what's next?

I have seen police presence - and that is great - but to be honest it has come at the times when the speed and traffic isn't a problem. IN all honesty - the worst times are in the evenings, and then during cottage traffic time, Friday nights are pretty bad, but Sundays are the worst.

Cottagers trying to avoid traffic on Highway 23 cut through Clovelly Cove/Irving/Riverview Beach Rd with hopes of avoiding the backlog, only to just get back into traffic. Is there any possibility of having police (preferably hidden) to catch these people during the above mentioned 'bad times'?

Although I may be the only one writing to you, I can promise you there are many other families on this road, with children, that have the same concerns. Over the last few years there have been a few more families moving in and now we have quite a few young families with children ranging from ages 2-15. Not as though the children are playing on the road, but they are all manly friends and need to travel from one house to the next - I am getting increasingly concerned as it is still a pretty dangerous thing for them at times. Many of us parents are wondering how a street can go about getting one of those street signs that has it posted that there are children on the road to caution drivers?

Thank you again for taking the time to listen to my concerns. I appreciate that things are being done to help stop this problem. I hope to hear from you soon, so that a solution can be had. Last night was very scary for my son and I - I don't want this to happen to anyone else.

Keep Ontario Roads Safe for Kids This School Year

Province Reminding Drivers to Be Alert near School Buses and in School Zones

As another school year begins, Ontario is reminding drivers to be alert, [put down the phone](#) and follow the rules when driving near school buses and in school zones.

Almost 834,000 students travel on school buses every day across Ontario. To help keep them safe, drivers should:

- Drive with caution when approaching or passing a school bus
- Obey the speed limit and be prepared to stop for a school bus at any time, not just during school hours
- Never pass a stopped school bus with red upper lights flashing - it's against the law
- Leave space around school buses so children can get on and off safely
- Stop and yield the whole roadway at pedestrian crossovers, school crossings and other locations where there is a crossing guard.

Parents should also remind their children to be aware of their surroundings when getting on or off school buses.

QUICK FACTS

- Last year, Ontario passed its [Making Ontario's Roads Safer](#) legislation, clarifying that a school bus is the only bus that may be painted chrome yellow to be easily identified.
- Drivers failing to stop for a school bus can be fined up to \$2,000 and receive six demerit points for a first conviction.

- Distracted driving is a leading cause of collisions on Ontario roads. According to 2013 collision statistics, the number of distracted driving fatalities has more than doubled since the year 2000 and one person is injured in a distracted driving collision every 30 minutes.
- Drivers now caught talking, texting, typing, dialing or e-mailing using a hand-held cellphone and other hand-held communication and entertainment device face a fine of up to \$1,000 and receive three demerit points upon conviction.
