Award of contract for supply and delivery of winter road salt

Council approved the award of contract for supply and delivery of winter road salt to Compass Minerals Canada Corp. for three years with two optional one-year extensions. The Town applies road salt and sand to roads throughout the winter period to prevent ice formation and provide traction. The Town has participated in the York Region Purchasing Co-operative to purchase bulk winter road salt with its neighbouring municipalities and York Region to obtain the best pricing based on volume discount.

Windrow snow clearing program analysis

Council approved a pilot windrow clearing program to begin on Feb. 1, 2022. Applications may be submitted online or by calling the Town's Customer Service Centre. Households are eligible if each person over the age of 12 meet one of the following requirements – they are 65 years of age or older, or, under 65 years of age and have documentation identifying a disability verifying they are unable to shovel snow. Approved applicants can expect to see service after a minimum 7.5-centimetre (three-inch) snowfall event and within 24 hours after the snow plowing of roads and sidewalks are completed.

We would also like to acknowledge the Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation as our close neighbour and friend, one with which we strive to build a cooperative and respectful relationship.

We also recognize the unique relationship the Chippewas have with the lands and waters of this territory. They are the water protectors and environmental stewards of these lands and we join them in these responsibilities.
