Jersey House

Hiram Moore was a Lumber Merchant, Justice of the Peace, and Tavern Keeper of the Jersey House. Jersey was a community on the south-side of the Maskinonge, or Jersey River, on the Queensway. Hiram died in 1872, and towards the end of his life he was trying to sell his hotel. One ad describes its convenience thusly: *This hotel being situated on the main travelled road between Newmarket; Sutton and Beaverton and at which Stages carrying mails make regular calls, is reckoned one of the best stands on the line.*



Several ads ran in the Newmarket Era in the early 1870s to rent the Jersey House. It finally went up for public auction in 1873, after Hiram Moore's death.
