The Georgina Pioneer Village & Archives has assembled the talents of David Morris from *History Comes Alive* to portray William Lyon Mackenzie, re-enactors from the Incorporated Militia of Upper Canada and the Lloydtown Company, as well as numerous historic demonstrators and interpreters, who together will provide you and your students with an unforgettable day of learning.

### **Curriculum Links:**

Rise to Rebellion Education Day is directly linked to the Grade 7 History Unit Conflict and Change.

As part of Education Day, students will:

- Investigate the causes of the 1837 Rebellion of Upper Canada through interaction with key personalities involved in the conflict.
- Analyse the competing points of view put forward by William Lyon Mackenzie and Sir Francis Bond Head, and examine how their differences led to armed conflict. After booking, each participating class will be assigned a side that they must represent during Education Day. Teachers will then be mailed a preparation package to help them prepare their students for Education Day. These instructions will provoke students to think critically about the issues they will be supporting, and how they differ with the competing point of view.
- Learn appropriate vocabulary used by both sides of the debate over responsible government. Your package will include a list of terms employed by the Rebels and Loyalists. Additionally, through contact with costumed personalities and historical demonstrators, students will have the opportunity to further compare and contrast the words chosen by William Lyon Mackenzie and Sir Francis Bond Head as they attempt to sway students' opinions.
- Witness first-hand the outcome of the armed conflict between Mackenzie's Rebels and Bond Head's Loyalist forces.

# The ROC & R2R

Turn your Rise to Rebellion Program into a full day experience by adding on climbing activities to your day. The Georgina Pioneer Village is right next to The ROC Challenge Course and it is only a short walk for your students. There is a morning and afternoon session featuring two options.

# Option 1: Low Ropes & Climbing Wall

Challenge participants on the ground as well as in the air! Participants will start off traversing on elements that are less than 1ft off the ground, such as swinging tires, tight ropes, zig-zags and much more. Participants will also experience our multi-route rock wall featuring inverts, overhangs and angled climbs.

# Option 2: High Ropes Course

Participants will traverse from element to element 25ft in the air on our amazing high ropes course! Participants will be paired up in teams of 2 and will explore the rickety bridge, cargo crossing, space loops and much, much more!
